DEPARTMENT OF TENNESSEE CONVENTION: The 2026 Department Convention is at the Sheraton Music City, Nashville, June 26-28, 2026. NATIONAL CONVENTION – August 27 - September 3, Louisville, KY. We will stay at the Spring Hill Suites Louisville Downtown. If you intend to become a Delegate, delegate election happens at the caucus on Sunday June 28, 2026, at Department Convention, Sheraton Music City. Recommend registering early as delegates get priority. We cannot take reservations after July 24th, 2026. All rooms must be reserved through the Department, rooms are \$138 plus \$24.37 tax and fees, for \$162.37 per night. For those driving, self-parking is \$19 per day. The registration fee is \$40 per person. The registration form will be finalized soon and available on our website landing page.

DEPARTMENT CONVENTION: RE:Department Constitution Article V, Section 2. *“At the Department Convention, each chartered Post of The American Legion in the state shall be entitled to five delegates and five alternates; provided the Post has in good standing the fifteen members required for Charter. One additional delegate and alternate is authorized for each additional fifteen members or major fraction thereof. Post membership will be calculated by adding the current paid Post members to those Post 2000 transfers completed during the current renewal year. No delegate shall be seated unless the annual dues have been received by the Department Adjutant prior to Post delegate selection. **Delegates shall be chosen at Post meetings not less than one week before the Department Convention.**”*

The Department uses this information to track our activity and determine awards, and the National Commander uses it to document the work that the Legion is doing across the country.

You can fill your report out gradually as you hold events at your post. Just be sure that you choose the Save Draft option rather than the Submit Final option. Due by May 15, 2026, for Awards Board evaluation.
